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Dear Parents and Guardians,

New Jersey public schools are required to give a statewide assessment called the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC). The assessments are administered to students in grades 3 through 11 and are designed to measure whether students are meeting the NJ Student Learning Standards in English/Language Arts and Mathematics.

Park Ridge Jr./Sr. High School will be administering the English/Language Arts portion of the test on the mornings of April 25, 26, and 27. The Mathematics section will be administered on the mornings of May 16, 17, and 18.

During the testing days listed above, students in grades 7-11 will report to school at the regularly scheduled time (7:45am). Students will report directly to their testing rooms. The PARCC testing will take place from 7:50am to approximately 9:45am each day. All classes will meet on an abbreviated schedule following testing. The school day will finish as usual at 2:44pm. A period-by-period schedule is attached.

Please be aware that for the class of 2021 and beyond, students will only have two ways to meet the state high school graduation assessment requirement:

1. Pass the Algebra 1 assessment and the English Language Arts grade 10 assessment; OR
2. Submit a student portfolio through the New Jersey Department of education portfolio appeals process. In order to be eligible for the portfolio appeals process, students must have taken all PARCC assessments associated with the high-school level courses for which they were eligible and receive valid scores.

Based on the above information, participation in the PARCC exams is expected of all students in the 7th grade at Park Ridge Jr./Sr. High School. In addition to being good practice with standardized test-taking, PARCC provides us with valuable information about your children's knowledge and skills that is used for placement in courses.
